### President's Message



Thank you for your confidence in electing me as the new president of AFA Red Tail Memorial Chapter 136. I am humbled. I will do my best to serve well.

Before another word, a shout-out and hearty congratulations to the Marion County Civil Air Patrol Composite Squadron. Its CyberPatriot team, led by our own Dale Katz, took first place in this year's CAP and All Services CyberPatriot categories. They will likely be invited to more applause as luncheon guests at the 2021 AFA Florida State Convention in July in Jacksonville. We also need to enthusiastically applaud past President Howard Burke. As 2020 ended, he saw a

rough row ahead health-wise for both himself and his AFA-member wife, Lucy, so he resigned from his post as President. Thank you, Howard and Lucy.

Howard pulled the chapter together after Mike Emig died unexpectedly on Thanksgiving Day in 2014. At the time, there was no plan for succession, but Howard got us working together. He called in AFA Florida's then-President Dann Matizza for a meeting and advice, gathered up what records he could, and moved on. In the seven years since then, Howard managed two exceptionally successful Florida State AFA conventions in Ocala and numerous other chapter activities. On short notice, he successfully fulfilled Mike's commitment to host the 2015 state convention. He had the meagerest of historical records, little money in the chapter treasury, but full confidence in the abilities of the chapter and the Ocala community.

The state of the chapter now is good. The outlook for sustaining AFA Red Tail Memorial Chapter 136 into the future is satisfactory. Our finances are sufficient. Chapter membership, although declining, hovers at just under 400. Meeting attendance is comparatively good -- 10 very loyal members attended our March meeting. We've fulfilled AFA national's 2020 report requirements. This means that we have in place a full slate of elected officers and have completed all reports necessary to be eligible this year for full subsidy payments (based on membership) from AFA National.

Thanks to the City of Ocala, we have an excellent meeting place – a comfortable conference room in the new Ocala Airport terminal building.

Thanks also to our Vice President Steve Spires, we have an excellent newsletter produced reliably every quarter. It's an opportunity to educate readers about the Air Force Association and recognize members who have done good things on behalf of the AFA. Thank you, Steve, for your continuing commitment.

Where do we go from here? We face three issues: COVID-19, membership, and continuity. Some of our planned activities for the time being are questionable because of pandemic restrictions. For example, Christy Katz is soliciting nominees for Chapter Teacher of the Year, but we don't know where that will take us. Classrooms have been virtual. The 2021 AFA Florida AFJROTC drill meet is cancelled, and so on. Information tables from which we spoke to people about Aerospace Power have fallen silent.

Membership is a perennial issue. Members in the Air Force Association now number under 100,000; we are fewer than one-half of our number at the AFA's peak. We welcome new members, especially men and women who can get involved in leadership and in our activities. Our vision must expand to include both the U.S. Air Force and U.S. Space Force. We would like to see more veterans, AFROTC, Civil Air Patrol, and AFJROTC as members and involved.

Finally, there's continuity. Members who join us for meetings become targets for mentoring. We want a continuous flow of new leaders to take the reins at the chapter, state, and national AFA levels. AFA Florida has an especially glorious history of being the first and best in the nation. We want to contribute to that tradition.
